

The Specifics

Randolph Community College offers college transfer courses through the Associate in Arts (AA) and Associate in Science (AS) degree programs, as well as the Associate in Arts in Teacher Preparation and the Associate in Science in Teacher Preparation.

Students who complete the program and receive the degree with an overall 2.0 GPA and a grade of “C” or better in each course will be able to transfer to any university or college, which endorses the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) or the Independent Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (ICAA), with junior status.



Where Can I Transfer?

The College Transfer program is designed for students who plan to complete a bachelor’s degree at a four-year college or university.
