GENERAL INFORMATION

TESTING

Students must have a valid photo ID to be able to take the test at the end of their course. If you do not have a valid photo ID, your test will have to be rescheduled.

ENROLLMENT

Every effort will be made to accommodate maximum participation in the course(s) of your choice.

All attendees are encouraged to preregister to ensure available courses. Attendance is mandatory for all courses that begin on Thursday and Friday or you will not be allowed in courses on Saturday. Courses will be subject to cancellation due to low preregistration numbers, so please register as soon as possible!

Students should attend registration to sign in and there they will be given their class assignments. Registration will be located in the Continuing Education and Industrial Center with signage directing them to the appropriate location.

FEE SCHEDULE

All students attending RCC's Fire & Rescue Event MUST pay a \$30 registration fee. The registration fee may be paid by check or money order made out to Randolph Community College.

All IN-STATE students who are affiliated with a Public Safety provider are fee exempt from tuition (*but not the \$30 registration fee*). All OUT-OF-STATE students or NON-PUBLIC SAFETY affiliated students are required to pay associated tuition fee (*\$70*), as indicated in the Course Information Section as well.

FF Fireground Ops 4 (32 Hours) Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 2, 3, 9 & 10

This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1001: Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications (2019 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

Mayday/ Safety & Survival (24 Hours) Friday 6 p.m. - 10 p.m. Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. - 6 p.m. March 1, 2 & 3

This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to satisfy the key requirements of NFPA 1407: Standard for Training Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews (2020 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines. Contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

DRIVER/OPERATOR

Emergency Vehicle Driver (24 Hours) Friday and Saturday 8 a.m. - 6 p.m., and Sunday 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

March 1, 2 & 3

This course deals with the safe operation of emergency vehicles, driving skills, legal implications of emergency driving, and departmental standard operating procedures.

SPECIALTY COURSES

Advanced Extrication (12 Hours) Saturday 1 p.m. - 5 p.m., and Sunday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 9 & 10

This class will cover vehicle stabilization and advanced extrication techniques. Students will learn how to stabilize vehicles and extricate victims from the most challenging situations such as rollovers, under rides, vehicles on their sides, and multiple vehicle collisions with multiple extrications. This class will be mostly scenario based, with a limited amount of classroom time. Students need to have at least a basic knowledge of all power and hand tool extrication equipment. This class is perfect for the student who has a basic knowledge of extrication and is ready to move up to the next level of training.

Advanced Pump Operations (16 Hours) Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 9 & 10

This course will provide both classroom and practical lessons, we will cover advanced pumping strategies. A working knowledge of fire pumps, relief valves, pressure goveners, and advanced application devices will be helpful. Hands on understanding of evolutions and technologies in moving water.

Electric Vehicle Fire Safety (4 Hours) Saturday 8 a.m. - 12 p.m.

March 9

This course will provide fire fighters with necessary information needed to respond to emergencies involving electric vehicles. Instructor: David Reeves

Fire Chief 101 2020 Ed (8 Hours) Saturday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 2

This certification-related course is designed to apprise chief officers of the various aspects and complexities surrounding the operations and organization of North Carolina Fire departments. Emphasis will be placed on ratings and inspections, NFIRS reporting, prevention and relief funds, grant programs, basic line of duty death information, various state associations, and an overview of chief officer expectations in North Carolina. This class will satisfy the 95 insurance inspection criteria as specified by the North Carolina Administrative Code. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details.

Fire Chief 101 Update (4 Hours)

Saturday 8 a.m. - 12 p.m.

March 2

This certification-related course is designed as an update to the Fire Chief 101 Course. Course content is revised on a five-year cycle so that chief officers receive the most relevant and current information available. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details.

Fire Officer I (36 Hours) Thursday 4 p.m. - 10 p.m. Friday, Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. - 7 p.m. February 29, March 1, 2 & 3

This certification-related course covers the knowledge, skills, and requirements referenced in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1021 Standard, 2020 edition, for Fire Officer I training. Topics include officer roles and responsibilities, community risk reduction, budgets, fire cause determination, inspections, education, leadership, management, public relations, and other requirements included in the NFPA standard. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of relevant NFPA standards as required for state Fire Officer I certification. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact Office State Fire Marshal for details. Effective date January 1, 2022.

Fire Officer II (28 Hours) Friday 8 a.m. - 7 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. - 7 p.m. March 8.9 & 10

This certification-related course covers the knowledge, skills, and requirements referenced in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) I 021 Standard, 2020 edition, for Fire Officer II training. Topics include officer roles and responsibilities, community risk reduction, budgets, fire cause determination, inspections, education, leadership, management, public relations, and other requirements included in the NFPA standard. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of relevant NFP A standards as required for state Fire Officer II certification. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact Office State Fire Marshal for details. Effective date January I, 2022.

Rapid Intervention Crew (RIC)(24 Hours) Friday, Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 8, 9 & 10

This course will present the Rapid Intervention Crew (RIC) candidate with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1407: Standard for Training Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews (2020 edition). The course is designed to show the complexities of managing and operating on a Rapid Intervention Crew. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/NFPA 1407 Standard, 2020 edition.

Prerequisite: 18 years old, high school diploma or equivalent, TIMS and FF Certified Instructor: Perry Hall

Instructor I (26 Hours) Friday 6 p.m. - 10 p.m. Saturday and Sunday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 1, 2, 3 & 9

This course will present the Instructor I candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1041: Standard for Fire and Emergency Services Instructor Professional Qualifications (2019 edition; Chapter 4).

TECHNICAL RESCUER

TR Horizontal Systems (12 Hours) Saturday and Sunday 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. March 2 & 3

This certification-related course in horizontal systems will present the Technical Rescuer (TR) with the correct techniques for the setup, operation, and function of horizontal systems for use at a rope rescue incident. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines. Contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Reference: NFPA 1006 Chapters Five and Six.

TR VR Vehicle Rescue Block (40 Hours) Friday 6 p.m. - 10 p.m., and Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. March 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 & 10

This certification-related course in vehicle rescue will present the Technical Rescuer (TR) with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of Chapter Ten Vehicle Rescue of NFPA 1006: Standard for Technical Rescue Professional Qualifications. Individual courses included in this block are Rescue Operations for Vehicle Rescue, Vehicle Anatomy and New Technologies, Stabilization and Extrication Techniques, Large Vehicle Rescue, and Victim Management, FIP-5710 transfers as one block, in its entirety, to the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM). Students must successfully complete all of the individual TR Vehicle Rescue courses that are part of this block to get credit for any of the courses and to be issued certification. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines. Contact OSFM for details.

> The ESTC is about 15 minutes from the main campus. To get there, take Highway 64 East from Asheboro. In 4.5 miles, turn left onto East Presnell Street and make an immediate right onto Henley Country Road. Go about 1.3 miles. At the stop sign, take a right onto Old Cedar Falls Road. Go another 1.3 miles and the ESTC will be on the left. (Please note that GPS picks up the ESTC address as 3659 Old Cedar Falls Road, Randleman.)

RANDOLPH COMMUNITY COLLEGE FIRE ACADEMY

Did you know RCC offers a fire academy in the spring and fall each year? Being successful in the fire service today takes commitment and quality training. The RCC Fire Academy offers both. If you seek to improve your marketability in the workplace or to enhance your current skill level, the RCC Fire Academy will offer you an opportunity to complete certifications in a timely manner or successfully prepare you for a career in the fire service. You will be provided structure, quality training, and the motivation needed to be successful in attaining your personal and professional emergency services goals.

RCC's Fire Academy is ideal for potential fire service members as well as existing fire service personnel. The Academy hours will be 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday - Friday, with physical training included daily. New academies begin each January and August.

Upon graduation, Fire Cadets will receive N.C. Firefighter certification, Hazardous Materials Level 1 Responder certification, Technical Rescuer: General and Vehicle Machinery Rescue certification, orientation to the fire service, and exposure to several area fire service agencies, as well as the physical and mental training required to excel in today's fire service.

FIRE PROTECTION TECHNOLOGY TAKE YOUR CAREER AS A FIREFIGHTER TO THE NEXT LEVEL

The Fire Protection Technology program is designed to provide the technical and professional knowledge needed for officer level decision making pertaining to fire protection for private and public sectors. It provides coursework in managerial and leadership areas necessary for promotion for existing firefighters as well as a solid foundation for continuing higher learning in the fire protection community.

Course work includes diverse fire protection subject areas, including fire prevention and safety, public education, building construction, fire ground strategies and tactics, and local government finance and laws as they apply to emergency services management. Emphasis includes understanding fire characteristics and the structural consequences of fire, risk assessment and management, and relevant research, communications, and leadership methodologies.
