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GENERAL INFORMATION

TESTING

Students must have a valid photo ID to be able to take the test at the end of their course. If you do not have a valid photo ID, your test will have to be rescheduled.

ENROLLMENT

Every effort will be made to accommodate maximum participation in the course(s) of your choice.

All attendees are encouraged to preregister to ensure available courses. Attendance is mandatory for all courses that begin on Thursday and Friday or you will not be allowed in courses on Saturday. Courses will be subject to cancellation due to low preregistration numbers, so please register as soon as possible! Students should attend registration to sign in and there they will be given their class assignments. Registration will be located in the Continuing Education and Industrial Center with signage directing them to the appropriate location.

FEES SCHEDULE

All students attending RCC's Fire & Rescue Event MUST pay a \$30 registration fee. The registration fee may be paid by check or money order made out to Randolph Community College.

All IN-STATE students who are affiliated with a Public Safety provider are fee exempt from tuition (*but not the \$30 registration fee*). All OUT-OF-STATE students or NON-PUBLIC SAFETY affiliated students are required to pay associated tuition fee (\$70), as indicated in the Course Information Section as well.

FIREFIGHTER CERTIFICATION

FF General and Communications

(24 Hours)

Friday 3–10 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 6, 7 & 8

This course includes instructional content for Orientation and Fire Service Communications. This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1001: Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications (2019 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

FF Fireground Ops 2 (24 Hours)

Friday 3–10 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 13, 14, & 15

This course includes instructional content for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1001: Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications (2019 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

FF Fireground Ops 6 (24 Hours)

Friday 3–10 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 13, 14 & 15

This course includes instructional content for Ropes & Knots and Search & Rescue. This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1001: Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications (2019 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

Rescue Ops 1 (24 Hours)

Friday 3–10 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 6, 7 & 8

This course includes instructional content for Firefighter Health & Safety. This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and ability to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1001: Standard for Firefighter Professional Qualifications (2019 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

Mayday/Safety & Survival (24 Hours)

Friday 3–10 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 6, 7 & 8

This course includes instructional content for Mayday and FF Safety & Survival. This course will present the candidate with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to satisfy the key requirements of NFPA 1407: Standard for Training Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews (2020 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines. Contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/2019 Edition NFPA Standard.

DRIVER/OPERATOR

Emergency Vehicle Driver (24 Hours)

Friday and Saturday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., and

Sunday 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 6, 7 & 8

This course deals with the safe operation of emergency vehicles, driving skills, legal implications of emergency driving, departmental standard operating procedures, and abilities to satisfy the key requirements of NFPA 1002: Standard for Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications (2017 edition). This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/NFPA 1002 Standard, 2017 edition.

SPECIALTY COURSES

Advanced Vehicle Extrication (16 Hours)

Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

March 7 & 8

This course will cover vehicle stabilization and advanced extrication techniques that will encompass electric vehicles, proper rigging for rescue. Students will learn how to stabilize vehicles and extricate victims from the most challenging situations.

Beyond the Hose (20 Hours)

Thursday 6-10 p.m.

Friday & Saturday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

March 5, 6, 7 & 8

Bridging the gap between the academy and real life - This course is about building firefighters who can be trusted without a script and emphasizes coordinated, aggressive fire control, teaching firefighters how to knock back fire, containing to a single room while searching for victims, and relaying conditions to command. Students will learn to read residential layouts, searching with purpose while maintaining orientation in zero visibility, civilian drag techniques, and removing victims under pressure. The final day will cover fast decision-making when conditions rapidly deteriorate, including fire behavior changes and self-survival concepts.

Full turnout gear with SCBA and spare cylinder, SCBA bottles must have current hydro-test date. Participants must have completed all classes as listed in NFPA 1403. Requires signed Live Burn Competency Form.

Fire Officer II (28 Hours)

Friday and Saturday 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., and

Sunday 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. March 13, 14 & 15

This certification-related course covers the knowledge, skills, and requirements referenced in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1021 Standard, 2020 edition, for Fire Officer II training.

Topics include officer roles and responsibilities, community risk reduction, budgets, fire cause determination, inspections, education, leadership, management, public relations, and other requirements included in the NFPA standard. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of relevant NFPA standards as required for state Fire Officer II certification. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact Office State Fire Marshal for details. Effective date January 1, 2022.

Prerequisite: 23 years old, high school diploma or equivalent, TIMS, FF Certified for five years, Fire Officer I Certified and Instructor I certified

Emergency Services ATV/UTV Safety

Saturday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

March 14

The VFIS Emergency Services ATV/UTV Safety course ands-on and classroom training for public safety personnel, focusing on risk management, hazard avoidance, proper operation, maintenance, loading/trailing, and emergency procedures for All-Terrain and Utility Terrain Vehicles in challenging terrain like mud, snow, and soft ground, equipping operators to safely respond and perform duties, often incorporating field exercises for skill application

Fire Officer I (36 Hours)

Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday

8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

March 5, 6, 7 & 8

This certification-related course covers the knowledge, skills, and requirements referenced in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1021 Standard, 2020 edition, for Fire Officer I training. Topics include officer roles and responsibilities, community risk reduction, budgets, fire cause determination, inspections, education, leadership, management, public relations, and other requirements included in the NFPA standard. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate an understanding of relevant NFPA standards as required for state Fire Officer I certification. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact Office State Fire Marshal for details. Effective date January 1, 2022.

Prerequisite: 21 years old, high school diploma or equivalent, TIMS, FF Certified for three years and Instructor I certified

Class will meet at Level Cross Fire Department

Rapid Intervention Crew (RIC) (24 Hours)

Friday, Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 5

p.m. March 13, 14 & 15

This course will present the Rapid Intervention Crew (RIC) candidate with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to satisfy the requirements of NFPA 1407: Standard for Training Fire Service Rapid Intervention Crews (2020 edition). The course is designed to show the complexities of managing and Operating on a Rapid Intervention Crew. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines; contact the Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM) for details. Effective date July 1, 2020/ NFPA 1407 Standard, 2020 edition

Prerequisite: 18 years old, high school diploma or equivalent, TIMS and FF Certified

NFA Incident Safety Officer (14 Hours)

Saturday and Sunday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

March 7 & 8

This course is designed for Fire and EMS responders who May be designated by the Incident Commander (IC) as an ISO while working within and Incident Command System (ICS).

Wilderness Search and Rescue Exercise

(32 Hours)

Thursday 3-10 p.m.

Friday & Saturday 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Sunday 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

March 5, 6, 7 & 8

This course will use scenario based concepts with both classroom and field work components. Participants will switch between managing a wilderness SAR event, planning search assignments using SARTopo, planning and deploying available resources, tracking deployed resources, and using the Incident Command System. Portions of the class will have field work searching the assignments created during the course in the Birkhead Wilderness of Uwharrie National Forest.

Participants will be required to:

- Bring a laptop computer for planning and creating SAR assignments
- Wear clothing suitable for searching in the wilderness environment
- Bring a pack with basic SAR equipment
- Be physically able to hike/search for several hours over several miles in the wilderness environment

TECHNICAL RESCUER

TR Heavy Vehicle Series (40 Hours)

Thursday, Saturday & Sunday 8 a.m. to 5

p.m. March 5, 7 & 8

Friday and Saturday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

March 13 & 14

This Technical Rescuer (TR) Heavy Vehicle Rescue series will present the Technical Rescuer with the knowledge, skills, and abilities to satisfy the requirements of Chapter 9 (Heavy Vehicle Rescue) of NFPA 1006-2021 edition: Standard for Technical Rescue Professional Qualifications. This course should be offered consistent with the most current NC Fire and Rescue Commission guidelines.

Prerequisite: Candidate must be certified in TR Common Passenger Vehicle (FRC 1207) PRIOR to taking TR Heavy Vehicle Rescue (FRC 1211). *Previous editions of TR Vehicle certifications and RT Vehicle certifications will meet the TR Common Passenger (FRC 1207) certification prerequisite.






The main RCC Campus is located at 629 Industrial Park Avenue in Asheboro at the McDowell Road exit of Highway 220 Bypass/I73/I74, just south of the interchange with Highways 64 and 49. It is 26 miles south of Greensboro, and Interstate Highways 40 and 85.



The ESTC is about 15 minutes from the main campus. To get there, take Highway 64 East from Asheboro. In 4.5 miles, turn left onto East Presnell Street and make an immediate right onto Henley Country Road. Go about 1.3 miles. At the stop sign, take a right onto Old Cedar Falls Road. Go another 1.3 miles and the ESTC will be on the left. (Please note that GPS picks up the ESTC address as 3659 Old Cedar Falls Road, Randleman.)

RANDOLPH COMMUNITY COLLEGE FIRE ACADEMY

Did you know RCC offers a fire academy in the spring and fall each year? Being successful in the fire service today takes commitment and quality training. The RCC Fire Academy offers both. If you seek to improve your marketability in the workplace or to enhance your current skill level, the RCC Fire Academy will offer you an opportunity to complete certifications in a timely manner or successfully prepare you for a career in the fire service. You will be provided structure, quality training, and the motivation needed to be successful in attaining your personal and professional emergency services goals.

RCC's Fire Academy is ideal for potential fire service members as well as existing fire service personnel. The Academy hours will be 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday - Friday, with physical training included daily.

New academies begin each January and August.

Upon graduation, Fire Cadets will receive N.C. Firefighter certification, Hazardous Materials Level 1 Responder certification, Technical Rescuer: General and Vehicle Machinery Rescue certification, orientation to the fire service, and exposure to several area fire service agencies, as well as the physical and mental training required to excel in today's fire service.

The Fire Protection Technology program is designed to provide the technical and professional knowledge needed for officer level decision making pertaining to fire protection for private and public sectors. It provides coursework in managerial and leadership areas necessary for promotion for existing firefighters as well as a solid foundation for continuing higher learning in the fire protection community.

Course work includes diverse fire protection subject areas, including fire prevention and safety, public education, building construction, fire ground strategies and tactics, and local government finance and laws as they apply to emergency services management. Emphasis includes understanding fire characteristics and the structural consequences of fire, risk assessment and management, and relevant research, communications, and leadership methodologies.

SACSCOC APPROVED

Earn an associate degree through Randolph Community College that will assist in promotional opportunity within your chosen field. The 65-credit hour program has multiple options that allow credit for prior learning to help speed you from first class to degree in fewer classes. If you have FF I & II, Fire Officer I & II, D/O Pumps, Fire Inspections, EMT, or FLSE I, II, & III or any combination of these, you can receive credit toward your degree.


